Managers and Coaches Meeting

- With the tournament beginning the morning of Saturday, July 18, there will be a **MANDATORY** Manager meeting the first morning of the tournament. Saturday, July 18 at 8:30am at the Tournament Facility.
- When you arrive, go to the central quad next to the Concession Stand and check in at the Tournament Table.
- **At this meeting, the Managers will be required to turn in their team Affidavit binders for a quick review and State signatures. My staff and I will review the State tournament process and rules.** Official Coaches are also invited. No Players please. The small nit-picky problems that can arise at these tournaments can be attributed to a manager or coach who is not present at this meeting.
- Your Team Affidavit Binder should include:
 - Team Affidavit, including the map, combined tournament team form (if needed)
 - Player verification forms with all supporting documentation
 - Strongly recommended: Proof that the coaches took the Little League Training for Diamond Leader and Abuse Awareness. LL does NOT accept the USA Baseball Abuse Awareness training.
 - Ensure that all your teams documents are signed by your League President and District Administrator.
 - Medical Release Forms
 - This tournament packet
- Once your documents have been verified and approved, they will be returned to you. It will be your responsibility to take care of these.

Opening Ceremonies: Team parade of all 13 teams and welcome message will occur at 10am and last 30-45 minutes. We would like every team to be in attendance in uniform.

First games will occur at 12noon, scheduled in pairs across 2 fields, every 3 hours.

Tournament Information - [District 8 Little League website](#) (under ALL STARS) State bracket will be updated at the end of each day. There will also be a bracket posted at the facility against the Concession stand wall.

Managers and Coaches are responsible to knowing the current year's Little League Baseball Rules and Regulations, including all tournament rules. See bottom of this packet for links.

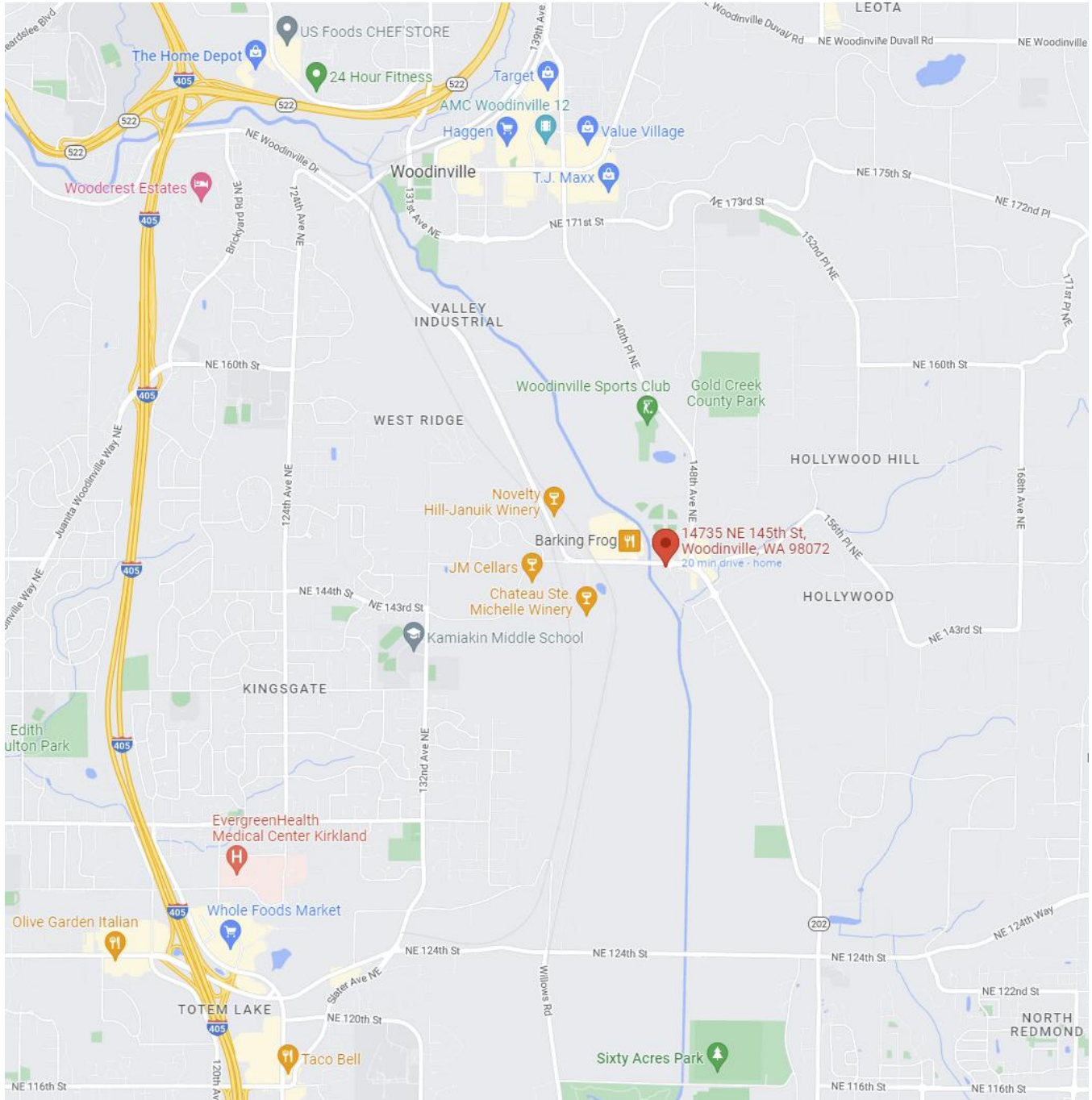
Sportsmanship

- Good sportsmanship is expected from all participants: managers, coaches, players, umpires AND parents. Any unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated, and will be communicated back to your home District Administrator and League President. Managers are responsible for the team's conduct and that of their parents.
- Should any of your fans get out of control and cause problems your League President, District Administrator, and/or your Team Manager will be asked to handle and correct the disturbance. If this is not successful, the Host Tournament Director / District Administrator will ask the offending person(s) to leave the facility. Last resort will be to contact Law Enforcement and Western Region.

Electronic Devices:

- The use of electronic communication during the game is restricted. You cannot **receive** any communications (electronic or otherwise) from outside of the field/dugout area under any circumstance.
- A manager or coach is permitted to use a rulebook, scorekeeping, and/or pitch-counting application on an electronic device without penalty (such as GameChanger), provided such devices are NOT used to **receive** messages, data or communications.
- **Penalty:** The penalty is ejection from the game.

Facility/Field Info & Rules

- Northshore Athletic Fields is a King County Park facility, and is governed by King County regulations.
- There are 7 fields at the facility. The 2026 Baseball 8-9-10 STATE games will be on Fields 2 and 3 ONLY. All other fields are off-limits to any use, and will actually be used by other organizations at various times.
- Field info: Turf infield, grass outfield, TruePitch portable mounds (LL Approved), double-wide safety base at 1st base, bullpens, outfield fence distances is between 200-225 ft, variable.
- Field usage is for actual All Star tournament games and designated pre-game prep warmups ONLY.
 - Team practices and/or batting practices are not allowed on any field in the facility. There is no drop-in practice or other field usage allowed.
- There is a full concession stand serving burgers, hot dogs, drinks and snacks. They accept credit cards.
- The Concession stand building also has real restrooms on the opposite side of the building.
- Here are the NO-NO's:
 - NO seeds are allowed, period. This is turf! Leave them at home or in your car.
 - NO metal spike cleats.
 - NO food in dugouts
 - NO beer, wine, hard liquor, or marijuana. This is a youth facility. If parents/spectators are caught, they will NOT be given any warning; the item(s) will be confiscated and disposed of, and the offenders will be ejected from the facility for that day. Treat this as your warning and discuss with your team parents.
- The scorekeepers table area behind the backstop is for approved Tournament staff ONLY.
- All baseballs hit outside of the field of play must be returned to the scorekeepers table behind the backstop. Do not give them to the team or hand them into the dugouts. We trade with candy!
- There will be a Tournament bracket posted on the side of the Concession stand building. It will also be updated nightly on the [District 8 website](#).
- Please clean out dugouts after your game. There will be plenty of trash cans nearby.
- There are spectator stands in the infield and outfield areas. You are welcome to set up shade canopies and bring additional chairs.
- Please encourage your families to clean up around the spectator areas at the end of the game.
- You are welcome to hang and display team banners and All Star items on the outside of the field fencing and dugouts, so long as they are not blocking the view of others.
- It is the parent's responsibility to monitor their other children that may be in-tow to the tournament.
- The facility has a play area for little kids, but as per the signage, you are responsible for monitoring your children.
- AED onsite.
- ***** PARKING *****
 - While the parking lot is primarily for the facility, it is a King County lot and we do not have full control over it. On some evenings, there will be other activities nearby and also some of the fields will be used by other organizations. Because of this, and the fact that the facility is in the middle of the Woodinville winery district, parking will be tight.
 - It is recommended not to bring multiple cars per family. Please try to carpool.
 - ARRIVE EARLY. If you drop off your players, leave, and then come back just before game-time, good luck on finding available parking. COME EARLY! It's a 5 minute walk to the center of the winery district.
 - Do not park on aisle end-caps blocking the field entrance gate. This causes problems for emergency services, as they do drop in. They will ticket and tow with no warning.
 - Do not park in spaces designated for tournament staff or umpires.
 - If the lot is full, circle the lot and check again. There is always movement occurring.
 - Overflow parking across the traffic circle is sometimes available, but it's a "use at your own risk."
 - The parking lot itself is owned and managed by King County, not by the facility. If there are any problems in the parking lot, contact the King County Sheriff at 911.

Game Streaming:

Fans will be allowed to stream games. You are required to bring your own equipment, including battery power. Signage will designate where you can mount your cameras on the fence, NOT directly behind the catcher on the backstop—but rather to the sides. There is no wifi at the facility – all major cellular carriers have strong 5G signal in the area.

Northshore Athletic Fields is in the middle of the Woodinville Winery District. There are a lot of boutique shopping and restaurants in the immediate area of the facility.

There are a lot of wineries and distilleries also in the immediate area. While we encourage the adults to visit the local establishments, please do NOT come to your child's Little League game intoxicated. Also, do NOT come into the facility carrying any alcohol, or concealing any alcohol. If anyone is caught being intoxicated or carrying/concealing any alcohol, you will be asked to leave. Failure to abide by this will result in your team's game being suspended until you leave the facility, Western Region will be contacted, as well as the authorities for public intoxication and trespassing. Your league's President and District Administrator will also be contacted.

When you are searching, there are two hotels surrounding the facility, but they are not exactly Little League family friendly. They are higher-end boutique hotels catering to the winery crowds, not a Little League team/family that is trying to function on a budget.

Tournament Details and Reminders

1. We will review the team affidavits at the managers' meeting and apply the State Tournament Signature when approved.
 - If you need to make a change prior to any game (player, coach), or there is an issue with a player or coach, please allow extra time for this to be properly handled and do not just show up for the Coin Flip and list out your issues. We are here to help you, but you must give us adequate time to handle and deal with your issue(s).
2. The Team Manager or Coach **MUST** report to the Tournament Director **ONE** hour prior to the scheduled start of their game for the coin toss at the Tournament Table at the fields. The team at the top of the game bracket will make the call, even for the Championship game(s).
 - If you are not present at the designated time for the coin toss, or you are not ready for the coin flip (Team Affidavit and completed Lineup card) the choice of home or away will be awarded to the team that is present at 55 minutes prior to game time.
 - If both Managers are present early and Tournament staff are available, we try to do the coin flip early.
3. For each game, turn in your Team Affidavit packet and its sleeve protector one hour prior to gametime, when you will also turn in your completed lineup card, and we will do the coin flip. The Manager (or Coach), the Team Affidavit, and the completed Lineup card are ALL required at 1 hour prior to the game for the coin flip to occur. You expect your players to come prepared to play—as such, we expect you to come prepared for pre-game activities.
4. Lineup Cards: The tournament will provide the official lineup cards to use, and ONLY these may be used for each game for tournament officials, staff, umpires, and the opposing team. DO NOT use your own. You will receive a couple of copies at the Mandatory Managers meeting prior to the start of the tournament.
 - For each game, the lineup cards must be filled out completely using first and last names, uniform numbers, and their initial numerical defensive position. Please use standard 1 through 9 designations for the defensive positions in lieu of p, c, 1b, etc.
 - Your completed lineup card is required to be turned in at the Tournament table one hour before game time to compare to the team affidavits, review pitcher eligibility, and allow the official scorebook to be filled out. Starting lineups are not official until the umpires' pre-game meeting at the plate. Final changes can be made at that time.
 - The lineup card is carbonless quadruplicate, so please press hard. You will turn in the entire 4-part lineup card. We will separate them after the coin flip (umpire, scorekeeper, opposing team, your own copy).
 - When you turn in your lineup card, Tournament staff will denote any ineligible pitchers due to days rest needed directly on the lineup card.
 - If you are missing any players on your Team Affidavit, please inform the Tournament Director when you turn in your Lineup card.
5. After each game, the manager **MUST** report to the tournament table and initial their Team Affidavit pitching record before leaving the facility. This is also when you can pick up a line-up card for the next game, or when you will pick up your team affidavit if you are heading home for the summer. **Managers who fail to verify the pitching for that game and initial the Team Affidavit will be conceding that the pitching record entered on the Affidavit is correct, AND WILL ALSO FORFEIT THE COIN TOSS FOR THEIR NEXT GAME.**
 - If there are any discrepancies, we will review and resolve at that time.
 - The Official Scorekeeper's scorebook takes precedence over a team scorebook. GameChanger data will not be allowed or utilized for this.
6. No teams are allowed onto the field or in the dugouts until AFTER the home/visiting teams have been determined via the coin toss.

7. After the coin-toss, the Home team will always occupy the third base dugout and the Visiting team will always occupy the first base dugout.
8. After the coin toss, each team can load their respective dugouts. They may use their respective half of the outfield ONLY to warmup until 30 minutes prior to game time. No infield usage, and no usage of foul territory in front of the dugout during that time. ONLY the Coaches can hit balls to the players. No player should have a bat in their hand. Any player acting as catcher while a coach is hitting balls or while warming up a pitcher must wear an approved Catcher mask with a dangling throat protector.
9. The Visiting team will take FULL infield/outfield warmup starting 30 minutes prior to game time and the home team will do the same at 20 minutes prior to game time. This will be announced for each field for each game via the PA system. Each team is allowed 10 minutes. During this time, the opposite team must remain in their dugout and can continue to use its own bullpen. Players must act as catcher for the coach during field warmups, and must wear an authorized catcher's mask with a dangling throat guard.
10. No team music is permitted once each team starts its team FULL field warmups 30 minutes (and 20 minutes) prior to gametime. Volume must be just enough for only the dugout to hear.
11. Pitchers and Catchers can warm up in their respective bullpens. This is players only. Catchers must at a minimum have their approved catchers helmet on with a dangling throat protector. Manager and Coaches are NOT permitted to warm up their pitchers or catchers at any time.
12. As per Little League Rule, there will be no equipment checks prior to each game. If a team wants to request an optional equipment check, please request this at the Tournament Table when you check in for your first game and we will notify the umpiring crew for your game.
 - The Manager of each team is responsible for ensuring that all equipment is legal and proper for play according to Little League rules. Penalty: If illegal equipment is used during the game, the manager and player who used the illegal equipment will be ejected. The Manager and Player will also be suspended for their team's next game.
13. You are allowed to have a cooler with ice, water and Gatorade in the dugout. No food is allowed. You are also allowed to have a bucket of water and mister fan (if you need the bucket filled, please ask Tournament Staff while your team is still in the early stages of warmups—not a few minutes before gametime)
14. Full team introductions for each team will occur at about 7 minutes prior to the start of EVERY game. All player introductions will occur with the team lining up on their respective baseline as they hear their name. Injured players may sit in the dugout and be introduced as injured, but can only wear their jersey shirt. They cannot wear the full uniform as other players (civilian pants/shorts). We will also play the National Anthem and recite the Little League Pledge.
15. The teams will then return to their dugouts while the Umpires conduct their pre-game HOME PLATE meeting with the two Managers. The Umpires will already have your lineup card and will confirm if any changes.
16. Only rostered coaches listed on the Team Affidavit are allowed on the field, which includes the dugout and bullpen areas. Your "extra" assistant coaches are not allowed on the field, in the dugout, or in the bullpen.
17. During the game, it is mandatory in accordance with LL rules that there be at least one rostered coach in the dugout at all times if there are players there.
18. Catchers must wear an approved catcher's helmet and mask in accordance with Little League rules. Dangling style throat protectors are required on all catcher's masks. Any player receiving the ball during infield practice is required to wear a catcher's helmet. This includes the catcher in his or her position at

home plate and any other player who is catching for the manager and/or coach hitting to the infield or outfield. Bullpen catchers are required to wear an approved catcher's helmet while warming up a pitcher.

19. Any changes to pitcher, catcher or courtesy runner announcements will go through the home plate umpire. If the game is live, please ask the umpire for timeout and then approach the home plate and scorekeepers table area. The home plate umpire will then inform the official scorekeeper of all changes. It is not the responsibility of the umpire or the official scorekeeper to give the changes to the opposing dugout. If you see the opposing team come to the umpire/scorekeepers table, please come join the party to get the information.
 - If you are changing pitchers or catchers, the moment this is determined, please approach the Umpire and Scorekeeper to announce. DO NOT wait until inning warm-ups are completed and the inning is ready to start before announcing your changes.
 - If the home plate umpire and scorekeeper are not properly informed of a pitcher or catcher change, then its as if IT NEVER OCCURRED. THIS IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY AS A MANAGER.
20. The official scorebook will be kept by the Tournament staff at the scorekeepers table directly behind home plate. We use paper only. GameChanger is not official and data from it will not be used to confirm.
21. There is no contact between those in the spectator areas and those on the field or in the dugouts (coaching staff and players). This also includes the team scorebook. If a team wishes to keep their own scorebook in the stands, nothing from it can be communicated to the field, team, coaches or dugout. If a coach in the dugout is keeping a scorebook, it must be done without any contact with anyone outside of the field.
22. You are expected to have your players hustle on and off the field. This will go a long way in preventing game delays. If you delay getting your team ready on defense, such as if you are having a team huddle, the Umpire may shorten the time for warmup pitching. Use your time wisely.
 - If your catcher is not ready to come out and still getting their gear on, send out a substitute catcher with a full catchers mask and dangling throat protector to get the pitcher warmed up. The Umpires will not hold the game waiting for the catcher to get ready or give extra time.
23. During the game, the coaches, and players must stay inside the dugout at all times unless they are on the field on defense, on offensive play at bat, on the bases, or as a base coach. While on offense, any player on the field must wear a helmet and keep the helmet on until he is back inside the dugout. This includes players acting as base coaches. Players not actively participating in the game (such as being injured) must not leave the dugout without the permission of the umpire, including to move to/from the bullpen for warm-up or go to the bathroom, and may not return to the dugout without the umpire's permission.
24. Bat boys/girls are not allowed. Players should return bats to the dugouts (next batter, batter that came home). Remember - If there are coaches at both first and third bases, the 3rd team coach must stay in the dugout—they are NOT allowed to come out of the dugout to retrieve bats or other equipment. Have the next batter, who should already be ready with their helmet on, retrieve the bat from the previous hitter, if necessary.
25. The LITTLE LEAGUE OFFICIAL RULES AND REGULATIONS will govern how protests are handled. Protests of judgment calls will not be considered. If the Manager feels that they have a legitimate protest involving a rule infraction or interpretation, please ask the Umpire for time, and once given, then approach the Umpire to discuss in a reasonable tone. Please indicate the location of the rule in the Official Rules and Regulation documents. All legal protests must be lodged by the Manager before the next pitch, play or attempted play in the game. Protests lodged after play has continued will not be allowed. The burden of proof will be the responsibility of the Manager lodging the protest. ALL PROTESTS MUST BE RESOLVED BEFORE THE GAME WILL BE ALLOWED TO CONTINUE. Only the Manager may protest or ask for clarification on a ruling—NOT the coaches.

26. Mercy Rule, per the Rule Book:

- 15 runs at 3 complete innings (2 ½ if the Home team is ahead)
- 10 runs at 4 complete innings and beyond (3 ½ if the Home team is ahead)
- There is NO 5-run rule for max runs in an inning during Tournament Play.

27. In case of an injury to a player on the field, only the coaches will be permitted on the field to attend to their players. If additional medical attention is needed, it will be handled at that time. All play must have ceased and time called by the umpire before the manager will be allowed on the field.

28. If a player is removed from the game due to an injury that required medical attention, the player must have a signed medical doctor's release before he/she will be allowed to resume play.

29. The games are on turf fields.

- We play in the rain, unless its unsafe to do so.
- If it is abnormally hot, we will take water breaks if needed, as per home plate umpire discretion. However, there will be no defensive or offensive discussions during these water breaks, or else it will be charged as an offensive or defensive timeout.

30. All baseballs hit outside of the field of play must be returned to the scorekeepers table behind the backstop. DO NOT encourage anyone to give them directly to the team or hand them into the dugouts. We trade with candy!

31. POST GAME:

- After each game, the manager **MUST** report to the tournament table and initial their Team Affidavit pitching record before leaving the facility. This is also when you can pick up a line-up card for the next game, or when you will pick up your team affidavit if you are heading home for the summer. **Managers who fail to verify the pitching for that game and initial the Team Affidavit will be conceding that the pitching record entered on the Affidavit is correct, AND WILL ALSO FORFEIT THE COIN TOSS FOR THEIR NEXT GAME.**
 - If there are any discrepancies, we will review and resolve at that time.
 - The Official Scorekeeper's scorebook takes precedence over a team scorebook. GameChanger data will not be allowed or utilized for this.
- Clean out your dugouts.
- Unless it's the last game of the day, please exit the field and have your post-game team meeting off of the game field so that the teams behind you can get their gear loaded into the dugout and start their warmups.

32. Per Little League Tournament rule, please remind your team parents that we welcome their positive cheering and rooting on their players and team, but there is to be NO coaching or communications from the stands into the field of play, into the dugouts or bullpens. This includes such things as a parent yelling to ask for an appeal at 1st or 3rd, telling their player to choke up, reminding them of what a certain player did the last time they were up to bat, or yelling out "Infield Fly". Let the coaches coach, let the players play, let the Volunteer Umpires be Umpires, and keep everything positive.

33. All game participants and spectators are expected to display **GOOD SPORTSMANSHIP** while at the tournament site and elsewhere. We expect the conduct of yourself, players, and spectators in the stands to be exemplary. Abusive language, trash talking and /or taunts directed at the umpire or opposing team will not be tolerated.

34. No air horns, artificial noise makers, walk-up songs, music with 30 minutes of gametime. No drones.

35. Team practices and/or batting practices are NOT allowed on the tournament fields.
